WHEREAS, there are approximately 820 calls for service annually for Martinsville Fire & EMS to respond to heart related emergencies; and

WHEREAS, approximately 5,000 patients receive heart related emergency care annually by Memorial Hospital of Martinsville and Henry County; and

WHEREAS, approximately 1,250 patients receive heart catheterizations annually by Memorial Hospital of Martinsville and Henry County; and

WHEREAS, approximately 85 patients receive cardiac rehabilitation annually by Memorial Hospital of Martinsville and Henry County; and

WHEREAS, these members of Martinsville Fire & EMS along with the employees of Memorial Hospital of Martinsville and Henry County are committed to the delivery of quality of care for the patients experiences heart related complications; and

Issue: Consider approval of addition to Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy list–April 1, 2014 through March 31, 2015
