Proclamation

RECOGNIZING McCABE MEMORIAL BAPTIST CHURCH'S 75th ANNIVERSARY

WHEREAS, McCabe Memorial Baptist Church located at 107 Clearview Drive had its beginnings in May, 1939 as a Sunday School, meeting in the home of Mr. and Mrs. Charles B. Amos; and

WHEREAS, Roselawn Development Corporation gave land for a building site on Clearview Drive and on Saturday, October 21, 1939, men of the Sunday School erected a tabernacle in one day, which became known as "The One Day Church"; and

WHEREAS, In January, 1940, an organizational meeting was held and the Northside Baptist Church was constituted with 88 charter members with the Rev. V. P. Locke, member of First Baptist Church of Martinsville called as the first pastor; and

WHEREAS, In 1942, the first of the present buildings was built and the name changed to the McCabe Memorial Baptist Church in honor of Dr. J. P. McCabe, long-time pastor of the First Baptist Church of Martinsville, who gave of his time and resources to this church and many other churches in the area; and

WHEREAS, On Sunday, August 30, 2015, McCabe Memorial Baptist Church will celebrate its 75th anniversary as a place of worship and ministry to the community;

NOW, THEREFORE, On this 25th day of August, 2015, the Martinsville City Council hereby proclaims its recognition of McCabe Memorial Baptist Church on its 75th anniversary of service, worship, and ministry to our community, and extends its best wishes for a joyful Homecoming event on August 30, 2015 and for continued success for many years to come.
