





Drug Take-Back

The Martinsville Police Department conducted two drug take-backs in 2024.

Over 417.7 pounds of unused prescription medications were safely disposed of as a result of this event!



VLEPSC Accredited Agency

The Martinsville Police Department is an accredited agency through the Virginia Law Enforcement Professional Standards Commission. The Department was first accredited in 1998 and has maintained accreditation for 4-year intervals in 2003, 2007, 2011, 2015, 2019 and most recently in January of 2023. Accreditation is the ongoing process whereby agencies evaluate policy and procedure against established criteria and have compliance with that criteria verified by an independent and authoritative body..



Grants & New Equipment

School Zone Speed Enforcement--School zone speed enforcement keep students, parents, and staff safe during peak hours. While most drivers understand how important it is to obey these speed limits, sometimes, the rush of daily life may lead to a momentary lapse in judgment. Maybe you were zoning out and didn't see the speed limit sign, were texting while driving, or in a hurry to get to work.

Cell Brite-provides tools for law enforcement agencies and service providers to collect, review, analyze and manage digital data

DMV Grant-Each year the Martinsville Police Department receives grant funding from the Division of Motor Vehicles. Based on statistical data, the grants are given to jurisdictions in an effort to reduce accidents, injuries and deaths related to vehicle crashes. The 2024 funding was used to purchase a new radar unit and fund additional traffic enforcement efforts.

Total DMV Grant - \$15,001

Grants & New Equipment

Flock cameras which monitor traffic and read the vehicles' license plates.. Assists with vehicles that are reported stolen or otherwise of interest to the police, instantly alerting nearby officers upon a match.

Tru-Narc- Assists with testing drugs in the field.

Bold Blue Line Grant- Governor Glenn Youngkin stood with Attorney General Jason Miyares, Lt. Governor Winsome Earle-Sears, and mayors, police chiefs, and sheriffs from across Virginia to announce Operation Bold Blue Line, a series of concrete actions to reduce homicides, shootings, and violent crime.

HEAT Grant This grant was utilized to purchase CLEAR software licenses. CLEAR is a data integration service that works with the license plate reader systems.

Operation Cease Fire Grant- **This grant was utilized to purchase Flock Systems Raven gunshot detectors.**

Total Other Grants - \$87,768.80



Operation Bold Blue Line



In 2024, the Martinsville Police Department continued participating in Operation Bold Blue Line and Operation Ceasefire Virginia. These two programs brought together federal, state, and local law enforcement. Governor Youngkin's Bold Blue Line provided equipment, intelligence, and manpower to target crime. Attorney General Miyares' Ceasefire Virginia addresses gun violence with equipment and investigative and prosecutorial resources. In the past two years, Martinsville has received over \$ 1 million in resources from these two programs, resulting in a 29.4% decrease in crime.


